President Grueneberg called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and took roll call, noting that all Directors but Director Garrett present. Fleet & Facilities Supervisor Greene led in the pledge of allegiance.

Director Dorland motioned to accept items 1,3 and 4 on the consent calendar. Director Slade-Troutman seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously with all Directors but Director Garrett present. Director Nelson requested to pull item 2, the Joint Workshop meeting minutes, to reflect the amendments made from the October meeting as discussed. The minutes were amended, adding the Board Discussion which the topics of discussion were the Communications Plan and staffing concerns. Director Dorland motioned to accept item 2 on the consent calendar. Director Hall seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously with Director Garrett absent.

Consolidation – President Grueneberg and Chief Robitaille met with the County Clerk in which there are just over 30,000 voters in Nevada County. 9,000 voters will be needed to protest the consolidation.

JPA – Chief Robitaille advised Director Garrett attended the meeting. The dispatch contract was approved as was the surplus of Command One for NCSO.

NEW BUSINESS

5. <u>Discussion and Possible Action, Mentions of Outstanding Service.</u>

President Grueneberg awarded Fleet and Facilities Supervisor Greene a certificate for Outstanding Service for an excellent job fixing Water Tender 59 which had sat for a year due to mechanical trouble. The NCC Fire Board acknowledged Fleet & Facilities Supervisor Greene and Service Technician Derek Margherita for their services in keeping all NCC Fire apparatus in service and mission ready. Their talent, work ethic and dedication are appreciated.

6. Discussion and Possible Action, R23-30, Fund Transfer from 722 to 758.

Administrative Services Long stated the district received a grant that was deposited in Fund 722, but since it is a capital improvement, they want to transfer the funds into Fund 758 and reflect the costs in that. Director Nelson motioned to approve R23-30, Fund Transfer from 722 to 758. Director Carrington seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent.

7. Discussion and Possible Action, Name of Reorganization District.

President Grueneberg advised LAFCo approved the name: Nevada County Fire & Rescue District. No discussion from the board. Director Dorland motioned to approve the Name of the Reorganization District. Director Carrington seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent.

8. Discussion and Possible Action, New Organization of the Board.

President Grueneberg advised the Board they will not be making any decision tonight on who will be remaining on the Board after the reorganization but wished to get approval for a 7-member Board of Directors for the new district. Director Dorland approved the New Organization of the Board with 7 members. Director Nelson seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent. President Grueneberg advised the 7 members would be split (4 from NCC Fire and 3 from Penn Valley Fire) based on tax appropriations. Both NCC Fire and Penn Valley Fire Boards will operate through June 2023, with the new board starting on July 1, 2024. Director Slade-Troutman motioned to approve NCC Fire having 4 positions on the New Reorganization Board. Director Dorland seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent.

9. Discussion and Possible Action, Appoint Members to the Ad Hoc Communications Committee.

President Grueneberg advised the need for a Communications Committee came out of the Joint Workshop in October with Director Nelson bringing up the idea to look for people within our organizations to assist in getting the word out and the various methods to use. Director Jordan and Vice Chair Wittler from Penn Valley Fire volunteered to join the committee. Director Nelson advised she would be interested in volunteering and advised she could assist behind the scenes and attend meetings. President Grueneberg nominated Board Secretary Tricia Bush due to her background in Journalism.

10. <u>Discussion and Possible Action, Amendment 1 to the MOU Between County of Nevada, Rough and Ready Fire Protection District, Penn Valley Fire Protection District and Nevada County Consolidated Fire District to Approve Resolutions in Support of Submitting the Reorganization Plan to LAFCo.</u>

President Grueneberg stated by December, we would like to pass the Resolution of Intent, but are putting it off until February. This is just to acknowledge the change and amend the original MOU. The County Resolution is 23-429. Director Nelson motioned to adopt Amendment 1- MOU Between County of Nevada, Rough and Ready Fire Protection District, Penn Valley Fire Protection District and Nevada County Consolidated Fire District to Approve Resolutions in Support of Submitting the Reorganization Plan to

LAFCo. Director Dorland seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent.

11. <u>Discussion and Possible Action, Accept Citizen Oversight Committee Resignation from Tom O'Toole and</u> Authorize Staff to Open Applications for a New Member.

President Grueneberg announced that Citizen Oversight Committee Member Tom O'Toole reigned from his position on the Nevada County Citizen Oversight Committee. President Grueneberg stated he would like to present him with a certificate for his hard work and dedication to our agency and community over the years. Director Dorland motioned to accept Citizen Oversight Committee Resignation from Tom O'Toole and Authorize Staff to Open Applications for a New Member. Director Slade-Troutman seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with Director Garrett absent.

CHIEF'S MONTHLY REPORT

Chief Robitaille addressed the Board stating the seasonal appointment has ended and two seasonals have been hired as temporary firefighters to fill some vacancies. WT 59 is in service at Rough and Ready Fire and Fleet & Facilities Supervisor Greene and Service Technician Margherita worked hard on getting it up and running. A new Admin vehicle was delivered that was fully outfitted and ready to go. He attended a meeting with Peardale-Chicago Park Fire where they discussed possible reorganization plans, he was the guest speaker at the NCLEFPC Membership Mixer and attended the Nevada County Board of Supervisors Meeting where our fee schedule was approved. He attended the Alta Sierra Town Hall Meeting with Congressman Kiley and Supervisors Hoek and Scofield, the NCC Fire Citizen Oversight Committee, and met with LAFCo. Chief Robitaille and Division Chief Sullivan advised Station 82 funding was received to start the Revitalization Project and hopefully they will get a bus turnaround at that location. They attended the Joint Leadership Meeting with PVFD and NCC Fire staff, attended both the County Chiefs Meeting and the District Battalion Chiefs Meeting. Division Chief Sullivan briefed the board on his meetings with Yuba River Cohorts, the Law Enforcement Fire Council Meeting, KNCO Interview as well as reminding everyone about Firefighter Thanksgiving on November 20. He summarized the statistics for the district, advising 339 calls for service with 41% as Fire Calls and 59% EMS calls. He reported a 5:50 average travel time for first due units to scene, 12 fires (9 vegetation, 2 vehicle fires and 1 structure). Rescue 84 assisted Nevada County SAR with a rescue near Purdon Crossing.

FPO Tellam gave the Fire Prevention Report highlighting several public education events at our local schools such as assisting GVFD with an event at Lyman Gilmore, attending the Fall Festival at Deer Creek School and speaking with kids from Alta Sierra School. Magnet Day is this Friday where winners from Coloring with Caution (a fire prevention week contest) will get to put their magnet on fire apparatus and staff vehicles. Crews participated in a Halloween book reading at Madeline Helling Library and passed candy out at several locations. Chief Mason attended the CCAI conference in San Luis Obispo and learned about lithium batteries. FPO II Tellam advised he attended and completed all 832PC courses and is now a Sworn Peace Officer. Chief Mason, Tellam and PT Fire Investigator attended a fire investigation report class. FPO Tellam met with faculty at an agricultural property bequeathed to the school district for ag programs on Chukar Road. Chief Mason and Tellam attended the Sierra Sacramento Arson Task Force meeting and the Sacramento Regional Prevention Officers meeting at SMUD. Lastly, FPO II Tellam and Division Chief Sullivan attended the CAUSS Meeting at the Superintendent of Schools office.

This class is distinguished from the next higher level of Fire Captain in that the Fire Captain directs the activities of an engine or truck company. It is further distinguished from the lower class of Firefighter in that the latter's primary function is that of fighting fires and providing emergency medical service.

Example of Duties:

NOTE: The following are duties performed by employees in this classification. However, employees may perform other related duties as required. Each individual in the classification does not necessarily perform all duties listed.

- 1. Responds to emergency calls, fire alarms and non-emergency calls for assistance as a member of a fire company by driving assigned vehicle to fire scenes and other locations.
- 2. Follows current SSV EMT-B protocols, radios, generators, smoke ejectors, etc.; administers first aid; lays and connects hose lines; holds nozzles and directs water streams; raises and climbs ladders; enters burning buildings to remove persons from danger; uses portable extinguishers, axes, bars, hooks, lines, power tools, and other equipment. Spots the equipment; sets up for pumping or drafting; sets and adjust controls on the apparatus to deliver required water pressure and flows.
- 3. Lays hose lines and supply lines; ventilates buildings to release heat and smoke; places salvage covers to

prevent water damage; overhauls and cleans up after a fire; checks for fire extension and to prevent rekindling. May establish wildland fire lines by cutting, scraping, and shoveling.

- 4. Skilled in the operation of District apparatus and is required to drive and operate same in a consistent and safe manner with due regard for the welfare of the public and the District.
- 5. Returns District equipment to its proper place before leaving the emergency scene. On arrival at the fire station, cleans services, and returns apparatus and equipment to in-service status.
- 6. Cleans and maintains station quarters and grounds; performs first-line preventative maintenance on apparatus; cleans, maintains and tests emergency equipment; and participates in drills and training sessions.
- 7. Studies and becomes familiar with District streets, fire hydrants, building occupancy and contents.
- 8. Maintains level of physical condition to perform duties.
- Conducts fire inspections of commercial, industrial and other public buildings and multiple dwellings for compliance with fire regulations and ordinances and reports all hazards to the Fire Prevention section; pre-fire plans target hazards; conducts station visits by schools and may participate in other public speaking presentations.
- Complies and submits information on equipment, emergency runs, airway equipment use, accidents, gas
 and oil use, apparatus inspections and tests, fire inspections using conventional and computerized
 methods.
- 11. Participates and meets the minimum District training programs and requirements.
- 12. Prepares performance evaluations and counseling of assigned subordinate personnel.
- 13. Is subject to emergency call-back while off duty.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Experience:

Minimum of thirty-six (36) months of firefighter experience, with twenty-four (24) consecutive months (probation included) as a full-time NCCFD Firefighter. Three (3) years (probation included) as a full-time NCCFD Firefighter.

License:

• Must possess a valid California Driver's License for the types of apparatus operated.

Special Requirements:

- Candidate must maintain minimum qualifications as written in Firefighter / Operator Position Description
- Fire Apparatus Driver Operator 1A and Fire Apparatus Driver Operator 1B Pumping Apparatus Operations Certificate.
- I-300 (ICS) Intermediate ICS
- Command 1A and / or Company Officer 2D, All Risk Command Operations

Desirable Qualifications:

- Instructor 1A & 1B and / or Instructor I certification.
- Command 1B and 1C and/or Company Officer 2E, Wildland Incident Operations Management 1 and/or Company Officer 2A Human Resource Management,

- Company Officer 2B General Administrative Functions, Company Officer 2C Fie Inspections and Investigations
- Swiftwater Rescue, Technician Level
- S-212 Wildland Fire Chainsaws
- Low Angle Rope Rescue Operations
- S-290 (Classroom) Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior
- Education: Continued work towards a college level associates degree in a related field

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES (in addition to Firefighter):

Note: The level and scope of the following knowledge and abilities are related to duties listed under the "Examples of Duties" section of this Job Description.

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Operation and maintenance of fire pumping equipment and related apparatus.
- Technical firefighting techniques and the principles of hydraulics as applied to fire suppression.
- Working knowledge of modern firefighting methods.
- Fire prevention and safety principles and methods.
- General knowledge of departmental rules, regulations, policies, codes, and ordinances; modern first-aid techniques.
- Basic building construction, basic fire chemistry.-
- Common office practices, including copying, typing, and basic computer operations.

ABILITY TO:

- Administer first-aid as required.
- Perform maintenance and minor mechanical repairs to fire equipment and other apparatus.
- Understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- Function as a firefighter when necessary.
- Communicate effectively with the public and co-workers under adverse circumstances requiring presence of mind, sensitivity, interest and understanding.
- Adapt to changes in work assignments and duties.
- Write clear, concise and complete reports.
- Perform physical tasks that require coordination, strength, dexterity and stamina.
- Understand the proper operation and use of department equipment.
- Use a variety of hand and power tools (axes, extrication tools, chainsaw, and most common hand tools).
- Use a computer for preparing reports, records and correspondence.
- Perform strenuous physical tasks such as carrying equipment up hills, pulling hoses, carrying injured persons, raining ladders and operating a hose line.
- Conduct tours, fire demonstrations, first-aid demonstrations, and other public relations duties.
- Read maps.
- Draw building layouts to scale.
- Work at various heights and confined areas.
- Use radio communications equipment and speak clearly.
- Remain calm and work effectively in stressful situations.
- Use initiative and independent judgment when necessary.
- Perform shift work.
- Function as a team member.
- Use good judgment in emergency or critical situations.
- Climb ladders.

- Reference and utilize training materials (manuals, fire codes, journals, etc.)
- Keep accurate records.


- New Firefighter Testing began. 15 applicants have passed the written examination and will advance to a panel for ranking.
